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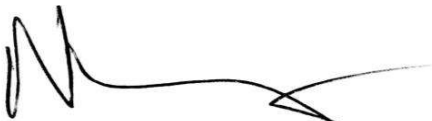

ABSTRACT

Keiya, Yosepina. (2023) *Near Future in Paniai Dialect of Mee Language*. Undergraduate thesis, English Education Study Program, Department of Language and Arts, Faculty of Teacher Training and Education, Cenderawasih University (supervised by Niko Kobepa, S.Pd., M.A. and Adelce Ferdinandus, S.Pd., M.A).

Key words: Near Future, Mee language, Tense, Aspect, Modality

This paper presents an analysis of near future in Mee language using qualitative descriptive method. The aims of this paper are to present a description of near future forms and to find the meanings of the forms. Data for the paper were collected from five native speakers of Paniai dialect of Mee language as language consultants. The findings of the paper show that near future has two forms: *neg-* and *p-g-*. These two forms both express tense and aspect. Data also reveal that when *ne-* without *g-* is used, it denotes modality. What remains to be seen are full analysis of the forms by using texts taken from varieties of contexts. Also, a complete discussion of complex system of tense, aspect, modality and may be evidentiality may still need to be discussed.

ABSTRAK

Skripsi ini menyajikan sebuah analisis tentang Kala Waktu Dekat Akan Datang dalam Bahasa Mee dengan menggunakan metode kualitatif deskriptif. Tujuan dari penulisan ini adalah untuk menyajikan sebuah deskripsi tentang bentuk-bentuk Kala Waktu Dekat Akan Datang dalam Bahasa Mee dialek Paniai dan menemukan makna dari bentuk-bentuk yang ada. Data untuk skripsi ini dikumpulkan dari 5 penutur asli Bahasa Mee dialek Paniai sebagai konsultan Bahasa. Temuan tulisan ini menunjukkan bahwa bentuk Kala Waktu Dekat Akan Datang mempunyai dua bentuk, yakni *neg-* and *p-g-* dan kedua bentuk memiliki dua (3) makna, yakni: kala dan aspek. Data juga menunjukkan bahwa jika *ne-* dipakai tanpa *g-*, bentuk ini bermakna modalitas. Apa yang masih perlu diteliti adalah analisis lengkap dari bentuk-bentuk tersebut dengan memanfaatkan teks dari berbagai konteks. Demikian juga pembahasan lengkap mengenai system kompleks kala, aspek, modalitas dan mungkin evidentialitas, masih perlu dilakukan.
